I James Cornutt of Grayson County do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say:

1st I desire that all my just debts be paid out of the perishable part of my Estate. 2nd after the payment of my debts and funeral expenses I give to my wife Molly Cornutt one third part of my Estate both real and personal for and during her natural life and if my perishable property should prove more than sufficient to pay my just debts I desire that my wife should have the over plus during her natural life. 3rd I give to my son Archelous all my home tract of land that I now live on together with all its appurtenances and also a Survey that I bought of Col. Dickenson of 100 Acres more or less & I desire that Archelous should have full and peaceable possession after the death of his mother. 4^{thly} I give to the Children of my Daughter Milly namely Polly James and Rhoda & Angeline one Equal Share of my Perishable property to be Equally Divided amongst them three by my Executors at the arrival of lawful age. 5^{thly} I give to my sons John & Jesse Cornutt the tract of land I bought of Silas Peace for them to have & to hold forever & I wish Reuben & John to mark off the constitutional line between John & Jesse as was contemplated betwix Reuben & John. 6^{thly} I wish all my personal property after my just debts is paid & after the death of my wife to be Equally divided amongst all my Children and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends William & Archelous Cornutt Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others or former wills heretofore by me made. In pursuance of an order of Grayson Court made at February Term 1824 directing us to examine State and settle the accounts of Samuel Cox acting Report Executor of David Cox Decd. We have proceeded on the 20th day of September next with 1825 at the Clerks office of Grayson after being sworn to perform that duty and beg leave to make the following Report: It appears that the Executor after distributing the legacies mentioned in the Will was then in possession of property Debts and money contained in a list which has been returned into the Clerks office and Recorded, amounting to the sum of \$2983.62 1/2 cents the principal of which was properly sold a part thereof on the 29th day of June 1819 and the Residue on the 22nd November 1819 and 22nd January 1820 the whole of the purchase money become due on the 29th day of June 1820 and since the return of the list of Sales by the Executor our report there has come into his hands accounts to the amount of \$175.53 cents which sum added to the amount of above will amount to the sum of \$158.79 1/2 cents and it appears from the vouchers that the said Executor has paid out \$135.98 1/2 cents and a note on Daniel Burford of \$8.39 not collected which added to the above vouchers filed makes \$154.09 1/2 cents which sum taken from the above will still leaves a sum in the Executors hands of \$3004.12
