I. William Bonham of Grayson County do hereby make my
Last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to
say 1st I desire that all my debts and funeral expenses be paid
2nd After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses giving to my wife
Elizabeth Bonham one case of drawers with its contents one long chest
its contents one large and one small chest with its contents three beds and
furniture such as she may deem proper to select two beds of leather of
her own choosing over five yards of fine tan & one pair of flag Irons
one large table one sun & side ones white and lids ones small four
pair fine chairs one to burn one bracket one cushioned tub one saddle
and bridles one pair of foot stools one pair of daggers all the soap and troughs
and the gardens over hundred pounds of bacon if so much or ham or
over fat hog all the meat over twenty bushels of beans if so much
or ham or so sun as it can be gathered also to have full possession of the
reservoir houses and orchard and further provided should there be any
ready money on hand at my decease it is my will that my wife Elizabeth
Bonham have full possession of it and should there be any money at the de-
cease of my wife Elizabeth Bonham it is my will that it be equally
divided between my daughters namely Margaret Farmer & Hannah Hark
Anna Ryffell Brown Richardson Mary Anderson Jane Hark & Elias
Anderson & Sarah Hagar and further I give my wife Elizabeth Bonham
full possession of the spring & spring house 3rd It is my will that my
Executor here after named attend as it sees that my wife Elizabeth
Bonham is affectionately taken care of agreeable to the requirements
of a bond that Joseph Bonham gave me for our support dated January
13th day 1844 and if by the said Joseph Bonham fails to comply with
the requisitions of said bond that my Executor at the request of my wife
Elizabeth Bonham. 4th It is my will that the said Joseph to comply with
said requisitions according to law and should my wife Elizabeth
Bonham become helpless or dissatisfied to stay where she is after my
decease it is my will that she rents out the manor house the smoke
house & parlor home & orchard & choose whom she please to live with
and that my Executor attend to the same and that he be allowed a
reasonable compensation for his services out of the funds arising from
my estate 5th It is my will and desire that my son Joseph
have two dollars to live and business for ever, 5th Deed unto my
Daughter Margaret Farmer twenty two dollars & forty cents
6th Deed to my Daughter Anna Ryffell Thirty one dollars
7th And after my daughters ~~Mary~~ Margaret & Anna shall have received
the sum to them bequeathed that the balance of my estate not otherwise
disposed of to be equally divided between my Daughters (Viz) Margaret
Farmer Hannah Hark Anna Ryffell Brown Richardson Mary Anderson
Jane Hark Elias Anderson & Sarah Hagar 8th And lastly I do hereby
constitute and appoint my friend William Hark Executor of this
my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others or former
wills or testaments by me heretofore made, In witness where
of I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 17th

day of April in the year of our Lord 1850 signed sealed published and witnessed by William Bonham as for his last will Testament in the presence and hearing of us who at his request and in his presence have subscribed our names as witnesses
